

(7th and 8th) Leader In Training Camp Curriculum

Leaders-in -Training is a unique program open to mature 7th and 8th grade children with a desire to grow in the Lord. LIT campers will focus on servant leadership through an age appropriate, unique and spiritually based curriculum. LIT campers begin their day with a thought provoking devotional chapel that will foster leadership principles. Following morning Bible study, LIT's leave the premises to attend all day field trips, four days a week, in the surrounding Dutchess County.

On Wednesdays, LIT campers will then participate in a field trip with the School Age campers and have a chance to apply skills learned from chapel during the week. It is our philosophy to introduce the scriptures at a young age. Use of the (NIV) or New Living Translation is recommended. Please note that all curriculum / teachings are aligned and affiliated with the Assemblies of God Church Denomination.

Important Information / Guidelines

This program is designed to adequately and professionally equip teenagers in the area of child care development. Leaders-in-Training will acquire hands-on experience in the area of mentorship with a role model perspective that involves our younger camp participants. Each LIT will be supervised at all times. The Director(s) and Staff Coordinator will conduct daily training and delegation of responsibilities. Training aspects will build and promote Christian principles, servant leadership, age-appropriate curriculum, planning / implementation, and camper safety. The Staff Coordinator of the LIT program is strategically chosen based on their credentials and experience to benefit your teenager.

Upon submission of registration the Camp Administration reserves the right to accept or refuse the registration. If approved, an interview / informational session will take place with each potential teenage participant and their guardian. If accepted, a personal reference request form will need to be completed and submitted. Understand, if any type of criminal history or disorderly behavioral conduct is present, the applicant will be denied entry. This is to ensure the well-being of the minors that we service along with the Camp's integrity.

Each LIT participant is required through ethical and spiritual conduct, to abide by the camp contract, guidelines, policies, and procedures.
