

Simple Guidelines And Rules For Campers



Main Guidelines:

- We always stay with our camp counselors and the group.
- We use our inside voices when we are in buildings.
- We should never hurt anyone or take anyone else's belongings. No rough playing.
- Remember to treat our counselors with respect by listening and obeying.
- Treat other campers with respect. NO gossiping-like behavior will be tolerated.
- Have lots of fun by attempting to participate in the variety of activities offered.
- Be reverent and respectful of camp chapel that involves Bible reading, worship music, and daily prayer.

Lunch, Snack & Bathroom Guidelines:

- We always use good table manners. We need to clean up after ourselves.
- Please take care of your business in the bathroom and exit promptly.
- We must remember to always wash and dry our hands.
- No rough-playing, yelling or disruptive behavior in the facility will be tolerated.

Playground, Recreation & Field Trip Guidelines:

- Keep our hands and feet to ourselves by treating others as we want to be treated.
- Never jump off high playground equipment like swings, slides, etc. Use playground equipment in the manner it was intended to be used to avoid serious injury.
- Never leave the camp property or wander away from the group. (Field Trips)
- Listen when your counselors attempt to get your attention, ask you to line up or to gather as a group. This is especially important when we are on field trips.
- Be respectful to the field trip guides by listening and obeying all guidelines.
- While in the bus you will be asked to remain seated with your back against the seat and your legs out of the aisle. Please remember to use your indoor voices. NO screaming or yelling will be permitted.

Note to Parent / Primary Custodial Guardian:

- Your child will be well informed of these guidelines during camp orientation.
- Obeying and demonstrating these rules are all part of a Christian witness.
- Parents/ Primary Custodial Guardians are encouraged to assist the camp counselors with the enforcement of these guidelines by adequately reviewing them with your child.
